Why The Aurum Verses Are The Final Authority

There are, currently, 215,556 digigraph principles (see [Digigraph Principles: Exhaustive List](#)). These principles are based on 30,000 aurum verses out of the 31,102 verses in the Bible.

The importance of these numbers lies in two principles. The first is the “Detail Conflict Principle,” which states:

In every field of study, there is always disagreement about details.

In order to avoid such disagreement from overshadowing and obstructing the benefit of the aurum verses, we follow the “Buffer Principle”:

Always try to have ten times the proof required to satisfy everyone.

What this means is best illustrated by some recent history:

The minimum number of aurum verses necessary to support the 2,000 core digigraph principles (see [Digigraph Math: How The Digigraph Principles Are Applied](#)) is 10,000 aurum verses. Three of our minor critics attempted to disprove the validity of these 10,000 aurum verses. Out of the 10,000 aurum verses, they claimed 100 were not found in all ancient manuscripts. They, of course, are wrong. However, because we have built in a “proof buffer” of 20,000 aurum verses, even if their claims were correct, which, again, they are not, that would still leave us with a buffer of 19,900 aurum verses and a total number of aurum verses of 29,900.
